Week 1 (18/07/21)	
Passage:	2 Samuel 1 (1 Samuel 18-31)
Lesson Aim:	Gods kingdom comes by God's action. David trusted God to make him king when the time was right. Jesus is God's forever king.
Lesson Outcomes:	<ul> <li>We want the kids to understand that</li> <li>God chose David to replace Saul as king.</li> <li>Even though Saul tried to kill David many times, David would not kill Saul.</li> <li>David trusted God to make him king when the time was right.</li> <li>Jesus was Gods forever king, and always trusted God.</li> </ul>

Car Question:	Why would David not kill Saul even though Saul was horrible to him? Who did David trust would make him king? In what ways did Jesus (God's forever king) always trust God, even when it was hard?

Week 2 (25/07/21)	
Passage:	2 Samuel 6
Lesson Aim:	God is amazing and therefore true joy comes in our lives when we treat Jesus (God's forever king) like he should be treated.
Lesson Outcomes:	<ul> <li>We want the kids to understand that</li> <li>David was a king who loved God and loved to listen to him.</li> <li>Although David was a good king, he was not a perfect king.</li> <li>God is a Holy God and we need to treat him like God – not just how we want to treat him.</li> <li>Because of Jesus – we can have joy and come near to a Holy God, despite our failures.</li> </ul>
Image:	
Car Question:	What did Jesus do for us that made us able to come near to a holy God?  David was full of joy because of who God is. Because Jesus died for us, how should we feel?

Week 3 (01/08/21)	
Passage:	2 Samuel 7
Lesson Aim:	God promised David that a king would come to build the temple and rule forever. Jesus is Gods forever king.
Lesson Outcomes:	<ul> <li>We want the kids to understand that</li> <li>David built a big palace for himself, and he wanted to to something for God and build God a temple.</li> <li>God did not need David to do anything for him.</li> <li>God was going to build a kingdom that would never end with a forever king from David's family – Jesus.</li> </ul>
Image:	
Car Question:	David was a good king over Gods people, but was he the best king? Why is Jesus the best king? What did Jesus do to show he is God's forever king?

Week 4 (08/08/21)	
Passage:	2 Samuel 9
Lesson Aim:	David didn't need to be kind to Mephibosheth. But he was and he was welcomed into David's Family. God has been incredibly kind to us and has welcomed us into his family because of Jesus.
Lesson Outcomes:	<ul> <li>We want the kids to understand that</li> <li>Saul treated David's family as his enemy, but David acted with love and kindness to Saul's family.</li> <li>David chose to show love to Saul's family when they were his enemies, just like Jesus has shown love to us when we were Gods enemies.</li> <li>Jesus is the only one who can make us part of God's family.</li> </ul>

Car Question:	Did Mephibosheth deserve David's kindness when he was from King Saul's family and was David's enemy?  How are we like Mephibosheth? What has king Jesus done for us?

Week 5 (15/08/21)	
Passage:	2 Samuel 11
Lesson Aim:	David was God's king, but he was sinful like the rest of us and made mistakes.
	Instead of trying to cover up our sin, we should say sorry to God.
Lesson Outcomes:	We want the kids to understand that
	David tried to cover up his sin, and we can be tempted to also do the same.
	Covering up sin doesn't make it go away. It makes it much worse. We cannot cover up our sin before God who knows everything.
	<ul> <li>Jesus is God's forever king who was completely without sin. Jesus is the only one who can remove our sin completely.</li> </ul>

Car Question:	What was David's big mistake?
	Is there anything we can do that is beyond Jesus forgiveness?

Week 6 (22/08/21)	
Passage:	2 Samuel 12
Lesson Aim:	Even though David deserved what was coming to him because of his sin, God let him live and stay on the throne. Gods forgiveness is huge, because he is loving and faithful to his promises.
Lesson Outcomes:	<ul> <li>We want the kids to understand that</li> <li>David was not a perfect king, but god was kind to him. That's called grace.</li> <li>David deserved to be punished for what he did. God was merciful to David and let him stay on the throne. That's big forgiveness.</li> <li>Jesus death paid for all the sins of his people and he covered the cost for them all, so that we who are guilty like David can be declared not guilty.</li> </ul>

Car Question:	What did David do when he realised how sinful he was? If we come and say sorry to God because of our sin, do we have to be afraid? Why or why not?

Week 7 (29/08/21)	
Passage:	2 Samuel 13-15
Lesson Aim:	Sin has consequences that affect other people. We sin and that hurts others.  But when Jesus died for us he ensured that sins consequences wont go on forever.
Lesson Outcomes:	<ul> <li>We want the kids to understand that</li> <li>The consequences of David's sin were felt in the future in his family.</li> <li>Sin has effects that go on and on into the future. It will affect us and others. The consequences of some sin lasts a lifetime.</li> <li>Because of Jesus and his death for us and the forgiveness he won, the consequences of our sin wont go on forever.</li> </ul>
Image:	
Car Question:	Everyone dies because everyone has sinned. That's the worst effect of sin. But God offers to give us new life again. What did God have to do to make this possible? How does that make you feel?

Week 8 (05/09/21)	
Passage:	2 Samuel 16-19
Lesson Aim:	King David feels the pain of his own sin, but King Jesus takes the pain of our
	sin for us.
Lesson Outcomes:	<ul> <li>We want the kids to understand that</li> <li>God chose David to be king over his people, the Israelites. But David messed up and hurt a lot of people.</li> <li>It was because of Davids sin that Absalom made himself king and was set against his father.</li> <li>God promised his people a king who would come in the future who would never mess up.</li> </ul>
Image:	We follow a perfect king who takes the pain of our sin for us.
Car Question:	What do you love most about Jesus? How do feel having a King who cried for you? Is there someone you need to say sorry to because of the pain your sin has caused them?


Week 9 (12/09/21)	
Passage:	2 Samuel 24
Lesson Aim:	David was Gods king, but he messed up over and over. Even though David
	was a king after God's heart, David was not a perfect king. He just makes us
	look forward to the real King – Jesus.
Lesson Outcomes:	We want the kids to understand that
	David's action caused sickness and brokenness in the land.
	David's payment for sin stopped the sickness.
	Sin must be paid for
	But instead of us paying the cost for our sin, Jesus pays it completely
	for us. That is why we can trust Jesus completely.


