


## **HISTORICAL BACKGROUND**



This is a big moment in Israel's history


→ Moses is Dead – will they follow Joshua? Will Israel cross into the promised land?

## **JOSHUA 1 - 5: ENTERING**






### **Observations**

- Joshua encouraged by God's promised presence in leading Israel.
- Israel avoids previous failures (Num 13-14) and obey God to enter the land
- Rahab's faith based on hearing about God's might acts in Exodus – over 40yrs ago
- Stone memorial to God's acts for Israel and the world
- Mana stopping God's provision for Israel is now via produce of land as promised

→ Remembering God's mighty acts should result in faith

# JOSHUA 6 - 8: TAKING (1)






### **Observations**

- Narrative structure emphasises curses and blessings
- Theses events serve to reinforce that Israel will only take the land if they are in covenantal relationship with God.
- Judgment on Sin is very serious (Canaan, Achan) but mercy exists, as shown to Rahab
- Shechem recite blessings and curses as required by Moses. Success is through submission to God's word not military might

→ Covenant relationship in action, blessings and curses.

## **JOSHUA 9 – 11: TAKING (2)**






#### **Observations**

- See Sovereignty and human responsibility
  - → God hardens Kings hearts, God fights for Israel
  - → yet Joshua still has to take it 'wars' a long time requires endurance
- Dependence on God requires wisdom we see negative and positives here
- Obedience to commands of Moses repeated many times.

#### ➔ Israel receive inheritance and rest

# JOSHUA 12: TAKING (3)





#### **Observations**


- Unity of Israel important all part of the Inheritance
- Emphasises that God's promise to Abraham in Gen 15 fulfilled
- Itemisation of God's goodness in giving all these kings over

## **JOSHUA 13 - 17 POSSESSING**





#### **Observations**

- God will drive out remainder, Joshua to ensure land allocated
- Remembering past victories (Og, Bashan) under Moses, Israel finds assurance that God's covenant love persists into present time as well.
- Caleb's faith anchored in God's promises takes action. Compare this to others, they appear lacking zeal, subjugating rather than destroying.

➔ Faith remembers God's past actions and looks forward to fulfilment of his promises.

### **JOSHUA 18 - 21 ALLOTING**





#### **Observations**


- Israel lax (Josh 18:3) Land given but they must possess.
  Requires faith, endurance, persistence
- Ch14 Caleb and Ch 19:49-50 Joshua bookend broader section – two original spies faithfully inherit their land
- Cities of refuge provision of justice
- Levitical ministry of covenant teaching among the 12 tribes.
- Josh 21:43-45 Key verse of book



→ God has faithfully fulfilled his promises to Abraham

### JOSHUA 22-24: KEEPING






### **Observations**

- After Ch21 where God is faithful, we have 3 occasions where Israel assembles will Israel practice fidelity to God?
- Israel act with zeal, but temper with wisdom. Have learnt lessons of Peor and Achan Sin matters to unity of Israel
- How Preserve faithfulness over time, over future generations


→ Continuing to respond to God's faithfulness. Josh 24:15 "But as for me and my household, we will serve the lord"

The return from Exile doesn't match the prophets words – partial reclamation of the land under foreign rule, covenant disobedience still occurs, we look forward to fulfilment




